Your library card  can be used at all Uppsala University libraries. Apply for a library card at ub.uu.se, and pick up your card at any of the libraries. Remember to bring your id-card.

Subject guides can be used to find subject specific resources such as articles, books, databases, encyclopedias, reference management and more.

Electronic resources can be accessed through UpUnet-S. Log in with your user ID and password A.

Book a librarian. Book an appointment with a librarian who can help you with search strategies, information sources and more.

Ask the library. Chat with us or ask a question via e-mail. The chat is open Monday–Friday 9–16.

Interlibrary loans. It is possible to borrow books and order copies of journal articles from other libraries.

Loans. Most literature can be borrowed but parts of the literature can only be used in the library. The guaranteed loan period is 30 days. Loans can be renewed twice.

Course books in social sciences are in a reference collection, for use only in the library. Some course books may be available for loan in the main collection.

Journals. A list of the library's print and electronic journals is found at the website: Journals A–Z.

UN collection. The largest UN depository library in the Nordic countries with a complete collection of UN printed documents for the period 1946–2010 and digital documents up to the present day.

DagDok is the library's guide to UN and UN documents, www.dagdok.org

EU (EDC, European Documentation Centre) and Council of Europe. The EDC consist of official publications from the EU institutions.

Public computers. There are a number of public computers available. Log in with your user ID and password A.

WiFi is available via UpUnet-S and Eduroam.

Copies and print-outs. The library offers copying machines. Find out more at www.korint.uu.se

Self-issue machines are placed near the information desk on the entrance floor.

Study areas. There are about 200 seats in the library.

Group study rooms. These rooms cannot be reserved, they are available on a first-come, first-served basis. Please observe that other users might need to access literature in the group rooms while you are using it.

Food and drink. On Floor 1 there is a break room with microwave ovens and vending machines. Please note that food is not allowed in the study areas.

Code of conduct. Please put your cell phone on silent mode and avoid conversation in the study areas. Quiet discussion is allowed in the group study rooms.
